Children suffering from trauma commonly experience repetitive memories and behaviors, trauma-specific fears, and changed attitudes about people, life, and the future. Child abuse is especially destructive when perpetrated by the parent, as it reflects a devastating corruption of the parent-child relationship. The child may experience an "accommodation syndrome" in which they may eventually attempt to normalize their experience of abuse.

Understanding Psychodynamics of Child Abuse and Trauma

If parents maltreat their children over an extended period, therefore, the theory predicts that such children may absorb these parents' negative behaviours into their own behavioural patterns and, later in life, when they themselves become parents, replicate/play out' such behavioural patterns within their own families (this is sometimes known as intergenerational transmission [of the effects of trauma]).

Trauma-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (TF-CBT) is an evidence-based treatment approach shown to help children, adolescents, and their parents (or other caregivers) overcome trauma-related difficulties, including child maltreatment.

Trauma Theory teaches us that when experiencing stress or a threat (perceived or real), the brain has three possible protective responses – fight, flight or freeze. The midbrain area is activated by the "trigger" and responds by increasing production of the powerful hormone: cortisol.

The prevalence of child abuse in serial killers is not a new topic. Researchers who study serial killers have noted that a large percentage have suffered childhood abuse and trauma leading to the suggestion that this could have contributed to their murderous behavior in later life. The term 'abuse' includes abuse personally suffered and/or abuse witnessed against another which involved violence or sexual acts.

Trauma-informed care is a way of providing services by which social workers recognize the prevalence of early adversity in the lives of clients, view presenting problems as symptoms of maladaptive coping, and understand how early trauma shapes a client's fundamental beliefs about the world and affects his or her psychosocial functioning across the life span.
