How to Tune Your Rig | North Sails

Rig tuning might seem to some like a black art, but once you master the basics you will be set for life. Tuning your rig - left adding turns, right measuring the tension using a vernier guage. To check the adjustment of your rig start by sailing close-hauled with the boat nicely powered up at around 20 degrees of heel - ideally with full sail in flat water and around 10-14 knots of wind, depending on the vessel.

Rig Tension - Tuning Guide. Most people know what their rig settings should be, but don't know the forces they are putting through the rig and the hull. We will try and help you get a better idea of what forces you are putting through the rig using the Spinlock Rig-Sense. We know the fundamental job of standing rigging it to hold the rig up, however we can affect the performance, safety and longevity of the rig and boat by having the rig over or under-tensioned.

The fractional rig - More "tunable" than the masthead rig. - Large main, smaller and fewer headsails. - More demanding to tune and maintain - the state of tune. Consider three aspects of rig tuning: - Trimming the rig sideways. - Trimming the rig fore and aft. - Final tuning under sail

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### How to Tune a Sailboat Mast - The Rigging Company

The settings that have been used for this tuning guide are based around a Solo sailor weighing 80kg using a Selden D+ mast and North Sail. However these settings still apply providing you use the correct mast and sail combination for your weight. The settings are dependent on sea state, weight, mast, sail and fitness.

Rig Tension Force 0 - 1.5 - 30 -100 lbs (leeward shroud just slack) Force 2 - 4 (max power) 500lbs Force 5 plus - 400lbs (with mast raked and ram forward) NB if the wind increases during the race and we can't adjust the shrouds we will depower by slackening the rig tension Measured using a Super Spar rig tension gauge.
